Dear 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade Parents,

Welcome back to St. Camillus – St. Virgilius CCD. We hope that you and your families have enjoyed your time off from school and all of the fun-filled festivities this summer.

We're excited and are looking forward to instructing your young ones and teaching them more about Jesus, His church, the sacraments, about family prayer time and so much more. But in order to achieve this, we'll be asking you for your support, encouragement and cooperation.

Please note that the children will receive a weekly assignment from their workbook (or a hand-out sheet) and they will also be asked to review their class work in order to be prepared for tests or pop quizzes. The children will also be given a hand-out when they attend mass -- a Mass Reflection card, which should be completed and returned with them on the following CCD class. **Attending weekly Mass is a must – not an option.** Mass takes precedence over ball games, birthday parties, sleepovers, etc.

Your child received two of our most precious sacraments last year; together we can encourage and reinforce the practicing of receiving Holy Communion and Reconciliation on a weekly basis. The best way we can do this – is to lead by example!

Lastly, it's very important that students are prepared every time they come to class. They have received a list of supplies which they should always bring with them. (This list has also been posted on the Parish Website, [www.stcstv.com](http://www.stcstv.com)) We would also ask that you would sign all homework and tests that are sent home. We believe it's important for you to know what your children are learning each week and to encourage them so they will continue to grow as young Disciples of the Church.
