



The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches “On Sundays and other Holy Days of Obligation the faithful are bound to participate in the Mass” (#2180). The Sunday Eucharist (Mass) is the foundation and confirmation of all Christian practice. For this reason the faithful are obliged to participate in the Eucharist (Mass) (#2181). Participation in the communal celebration of the Sunday Eucharist (Mass) is a testimony of belonging and being faithful to Christ and his Church. The faithful give witness by this to their communion in faith and charity. Together they testify to God’s holiness and their hope of salvation. They strengthen one another under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. (#2182)
